In sixth grade, we are working with interpreting data. We have read data from graphs and used our data analysis skills to match to frequency tables.

In seventh grade, we have been working on adding and subtracting integers using various strategies. We applied it to the real world by finding change in temperature in various cities.

In eighth grade, we learned to classify and compare real numbers. We are continuing to persevere through struggles with applying skills to real world context. We also are working on writing good justifications.

In sixth grade, we are working in Physical Science and studying atoms. We can define an atom and the subatomic particles within a model of an atom. We will continue to work with placement and charge of subatomic particles.

In seventh grade, we have been reviewing atoms to prepare for atoms and bonding. We can create an atomic model to represent the charge and location of subatomic particles and will begin positioning and calculating valence electrons.

In eighth grade, we are working in Life Science and can identify the 6 traits of all living things. We define a cell as the most basic unit of life and are working on unicellular and multicellular organisms.
